

Arundel Care Guide

Thank you for purchasing a piece of furniture from our Arundel collection. We know this robust product will be delighting you for decades to come. To help you get the best out of your furniture, we have prepared this care guide. Please keep for your reference. I

IMPORTANT: Arundel is made from solid Oak timber and the collection is sturdy and robust. Please take care and get help when moving the larger pieces of furniture. We recommend lifting rather than dragging the furniture to avoid damage to it, your flooring and, most importantly, your back.



Materials

Arundel is made from oak with a heavily brushed Natural IsoGuard finish. The finishing process removes all the soft wood, leaving the grain standing proud. This creates a wonderfully textured finish.

Construction

The Arundel collection uses sturdy four inch cuts of oak for its legs, angled in to create an immensely strong construction.

The table and bench tops are constructed using a frame made of two-inch oak staves. The centre section is made from cold-moulded oak, which is constructed by taking three 5mm sections of oak that are then laid with an alternating grain pattern to create a 15mm thick piece of solid timber which is incredibly strong and resistant to the natural expansion and contraction of timber, resulting in a top which is stable/and strong.

Finish

Arundel is finished in our Natural IsoGuard timber oil, which is designed to protect it from stains.

At Neptune we use IsoGuard™ to protect all our natural timber and we passionately believe that you can get years of stain-free use out of any timber treated with it.

It uses only the best natural materials and soaks into the wood and binds with it at a molecular level. Special waxes within the oil help it repel stains and marks without creating a barrier, allowing the wood to act naturally while looking its best.

Caring for your IsoGuard™ product

IsoGuard™ is strong, durable and will leave you with a stain-free surface if you treat it as you would any other natural timber finish.

The key is acting as soon as you can to clean up all stains.

However, hot plates and pans can still leave a mark. We therefore recommend that you use mats for hot/abrasive items.
